2. What is the difference between the words **DEPART** and **PUT AWAY**?
3. Would divorce for a believer ever be permissible scripturally? (see Matt.5:32 & 19:9)
4. One reason for not separating from an unbelieving spouse is given in verse 14.
  - A. What does it mean when a spouse is said to be **“SANCTIFIED?”**
  - B. What does it mean when children are said to be **HOLY?**
5. Another reason is given in verse 16. Explain this verse.
6. In the old testament, (Ezra 9:1-2, 10:3, 11; Neh 13:23-30) what were the Jews required to do with their wives and children who were not from the nation of Israel?
7. Does verses 12 and 13 permit as a believer to marry an unbeliever?

- A. What verses in II Cor. Chapter 6, would help us to answer this?
8. Verse 17 seems to say, that the outward circumstances that we were found in when we were saved are not what is of higher importance. How does the statement “bloom where you’re planted,” tie into this thought?
9. Paul says in verse 23 that we are not to be the servants of men. Explain this verse in light of Ephesians 6:6.
