2 Corinthians 2: 2-4

5. Based on these verses, how does Paul feel about the saints at Corinth?

6. If you see a friend of yours doing something wrong, what would you do?

What would help them receive your correction properly?

2 Corinthians 2: 5-11

7. How do you ask for forgiveness? Give an example.

8. How do you forgive someone else that has wronged you?

2 Corinthians 2:12-13

9. Paul says in verse 13, that his spirit is troubled because of what is happening in Corinth. This makes it harder for him to preach the Gospel, even though the opportunity is good to do so. What can you do to help the preaching of the Gospel?
