3. Give a brief definition of the following:

a veil

4. Why did Moses wear a veil on his face? (Exodus 34:29-35)

5. Explain why Christians don’t wear a veil on their face. Why is this significant?

6. Put an “O” by the statements that describe the Old Covenant or the Law, and a “N” by the ones that describe the New Covenant, the Gospel or Grace.

- The glory on Moses face was fading.
- The glory on our face can be increasing.
