Psalm 58

Note on 58:1: The Hebrew word in the first question literally means a dominant male sheep, or ram, but sounds like “in silence.” It has produced a variety of translations:

Do ye indeed speak righteousness, O congregation? (KJV)

Is righteousness indeed silent? Do ye speak it? (DBY)

Do you indeed speak righteousness, you gods? (NASB)

Do you rulers indeed speak justly? (NIV)
